ROM AND “AT RISK” INDIVIDUALS

ROM: Restriction of Movement (ROM) protocols will be observed during entire stay at Camp Atterbury to minimize risk to all personnel. Individuals identified as COVID-19 “at risk” (based on potential exposure or symptoms noted during initial at-risk assessment) will be placed in isolation barracks for up to 14 days, in accordance with CDC and MEDCOM guidelines. All other individuals will observe COVID precautions during the entire out-processing phase, to include social distancing, wearing of face masks, and separation from others who are not part of the re-deployment cohort. Upon release, individuals will be instructed to follow CDC and DOD guidelines for at home ROM (based on travel route and countries visited), in addition to following any State or Local mandates.
