Creditable Federal Service Introduction


What is Creditable Federal Service?


- Service that may be counted towards establishing eligibility for a federal benefit
- Includes all "covered" service
- Not limited to "covered" service
- Used for two purposes:
 - Retirement Eligibility
 - Retirement Computation





3 Tests of Federal Service

Examples of service not meeting the 3 requirements, but made creditable by law: **Peace Corps/VISTA Volunteer** 2 **Pre-1969 National Guard Technicians Non-Appropriated Fund (NAF)** 3

Service Creditable By Specific Statue



These systems are NOT covered by title 5 of the United States Code



Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA)

State Department Foreign Service (FS)

Central Intelligence Agency (CIA)

District of Columbia (DC)
Government

Note: Service may be creditable under CSRS or FERS once the employee comes under title 5 of the USC.

Service Under Other Retirement Systems



Type of Creditable Civilian Service

Full-time

- •Full-time credit for eligibility
- •Full-time credit in computation

Intermittent

 Credit for only the days and/or hours actually worked (WAE - When Actually Employed) for eligibility and computation

Part-time

- •Full-time credit for eligibility
- Pro-rated credit in computation

Seasonal

 Receive retirement service credit both for pay and non-pay status not to exceed 6 months LWOP in a calendar year



LWOP

- •Full service credit is given for up to 6 months in a calendar year
- •LWOP over 6 months in a calendar year is EXCESS


OWCP

- •Full credit is given for entire period of LWOP if employee is on the agency's rolls in a LWOP status
- No Excess LWOP

Other Creditable Service







*On January 1, 1987, CSRS Interim Employees were placed under the Civil Service Retirement System-Offset or under FERS

CSRS, CSRS Offset & FERS




CSRS Potentially Creditable Civilian Service

Creditability on Refunded CSRS Service




What is the Actuarial Reduction?

- Refunded service used in annuity computation
- Annuity is reduced by the amount of the redeposit
- Reduction amount is also dependent on the employee's age at retirement

Amount of Redeposit ÷ CSRS Present Value Factor (based on age) = Permanent Actuarial Reduction Monthly

FERS Deposit Service & Non-Creditable Service

Non-deduction Service Before January 1, 1989

- Deposit must be made to receive credit for the service
- If deposit is made, service is creditable for retirement eligibility and annuity computation
- The deposit MUST be paid in full PRIOR to retirement

FERS EMPLOYEES ONLY

Generally, nondeduction service performed on or after January 1, 1989 is not creditable, however there are exceptions

Interest will continue to accrue until amount of deposit is paid in full




FERS Refunded Service

- Agencies must <u>verify</u> the refund status upon reemployment of a FERS covered employee and contact OPM to determine if the individual has taken a refund of FERS retirement contributions
- Employees who are employed or rehired after 10/28/2009 can make redeposits




FERS Deposit Service

Effects on Retirement Benefits Paid or Unpaid





CSRS Redeposit Service

Redeposit service ending prior to March 1, 1991:

- Creditable for eligibility
- > Actuarial reduction in annuity computation


*If disability retirement or death in service occurs, service not creditable for computation purposes

Redeposit service ending *on/after* March 1, 1991:

- Service used to determine eligibility regardless of redeposit made
- Not creditable for computation purposes unless refund plus interest is paid

FERS Redeposit Service

A FERS employee who received a refund of FERS retirement contributions may repay or redeposit any FERS deductions previously refunded effective 10/28/2009 per Public Law 111-84
